ABOUT THE WORK

Bodylex is a gripping dance work exploring the physical effect of legal systems on the body. Laws are designed to regulate human behaviour. How our bodies respond to these pressures is a complex phenomenon. We must constantly navigate — deliberately or unconsciously — the tension between external rules and our subjective desires. Do we resist, conform or adapt? The answer is both choreographic and political. Dance artist and lawyer Rhys Ryan forges creative links between legal theory and choreography in this arresting work for three dancers. By isolating embodied responses to rule-based systems, Bodylex probes bigger questions about power, agency and authoring our own futures in a world of colliding sovereignties.

CREATIVE TEAM

Rhys Ryan (Choreographer) is a dance artist from Naarm / Melbourne working across performance, choreography and critical writing. He trained at the Victorian College of the Arts and has worked as a dancer with Stephanie Lake, Russell Dumas, Anouk van Dijk, Kate Denborough, Linda Sastradipradja and Chunky Move. His choreographic credits include Bodylex (Dancehouse 2021, Adelaide Fringe 2022), Condition (Dancehouse 2020), Synthetic Upper (VCA 2017) and, with collaborator Piaera Lauritz, Colour Correction (Melbourne Fringe 2018) and Self Repair (Melbourne Fringe 2017). Rhys is a lawyer, was a creative fellow at the State Library of Victoria for 2022, and a dance writer for Limelight and Dance Australia. Visit www.rhysjryan.com for more.

Anika De Ruyter (Performer) is a dance artist based in Naarm (Melbourne). She completed a Bachelor of Fine Arts (Dance) at the Victorian College of the Arts, University of Melbourne, graduating in 2019. During her time at the VCA, de Ruyter worked with various choreographers including Prue Lang, Sue Healey, Alisdair Macindoe and Larissa McGowan. Whilst studying, de Ruyter performed in the National Gallery of Victoria's 'Leap into the Modern' exhibition, in a remount of Gertrude Bodenwieser's *Demon Machine* by Dr Carol Brown. Upon graduation, de Ruyter was awarded the Orloff Family Charitable Trust Scholarship in Dance for excellence.

Piaera Lauritz (Performer) is a Naarm/Melbourne-based dancer, choreographer and internationally screened filmmaker. Recent performances include Billy Soy: a silly boy at Out of Bounds (Temperance Hall and Lucy Guerin Inc), Bodylex by Rhys Ryan, and A Midnight Visit by Broad Encounters. Piaera's dance films have been screened at festivals in 8 countries, with her 2019 work (like a) Less Dense Brick winning Best Film at Multiplié Dance Film Festival in Norway, and Softer Terracotta a 2020 semi-finalist at Dumbo Festival in New York. She has been supported by the Dr Phillip Law Travel Scholarship, City of Yarra, City of Port Phillip, Ian Potter Cultural Trust and

John Collopy (Lighting Designer) is a lighting designer working across Melbourne, Sydney, Perth and Brisbane. His credits for dance include Bodylex (Rhys Ryan, Dancehouse 2021), Dark Points (Die Angle, Melbourne Fringe 2019) and Inside (Milly Cooper, Undercover Artist Festival Brisbane 2017); and for circus, Sensory Decadence (One Fell Swoop/Gasworks) and Kilter (One Fell Swoop/White Night). The bulk of John's design is for theatre, where his credits include various works for The Bloomshed (The Nose, The Market is a Wind-Up Toy, Paradise Lost and Animal Farm). His other most recent credits include Slut (The Burrow), New Balance (Before Shot/Theatre Works), Thigh Gap (La Mama), WRATH (KXT/Melbourne Fringe), Rust (Midsumma) and Helping Hands (A_tistic/La Mama).

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

Bodylex is a 45 minute dance-theatre work featuring 3 performers presented in a black-box theatre with a stage space of approximately 9x9 metres. The preferred seating configuration is traverse (two seating banks facing each other), however end-on seating (one seating bank) is possible. The performers begin moving with sound before the audience enters the theatre. Once the theatre doors close, the first 15 minutes are performed in total blackout using light only from a prop. There is one segment of the work that features a voiceover in English. There is no audience participation. The target audience is one interested in dance, law, politics and/or contemporary art.

Staging

- Minimum stage dimensions: 9x9 metres
- Height clearance: 4 metres
- Black Tarkett flooring over sprung or wooden floor
- Traverse seating / two seating banks in opposition (alternatively, can present end-on / single seating bank)
- Black curtains or walls on sides (and rear of stage if end-on seating configuration)
- Wings / side stage space not required
- Total blackout required
- Props supplied by artist: 5m thin timber plank;
 SM58 microphone and 20m XLR cable (proponly not connected to sound system); blindfold

Lighting

- 3x3 grid of top light wash gelled in LEE 200
- 4 x high sidelights (approx. 2.5m off floor) gelled in LEE 200
- 4 x LED pars as floor sidelight (or as booms)
- · General cool front wash

Audio-Visual

- 4.1 surround sound (preferred)
- Sub-woofer
- QLab file supplied by artist
- Original soundtrack (no licensing required)
