ABOUT THE WORK

The Siren calls her onlooker into her alluring arms. Is this an innocent gesture born from desire for true connection, or a cunning tactic and peacockish display of power? Honesty is slippery and situations transform before they can be fully grasped. What might appear as truth can so easily reveal itself as fiction.

The Dance wants to seduce her audience. She wants them to fall deeply infatuated with details and her logic. The Dance will shape-shift for eternity, in an attempt to attain the power of The Siren. As new embodiments materialise, old skins dissolve into memory.

Bios

LILIAN STEINER (Choreography & Performance)

Lilian Steiner is a Narm/Melbourne-based dancer and choreographer, whose practice champions the deep intelligence of the body in movement and its unique ability to reveal and comment on the complexities of contemporary humanity. Her work has been presented in Australia, France, Italy, Switzerland, Latvia, Spain and Hong Kong.

Lilian is a long-term performer-collaborator with Melbourne-based company Lucy Guerin Inc. As well as working with other independent choreographers, she frequently collaborates with artists working with sculpture, film and experimental sound performance.

Lilian received the Green Room Award for Best Female Dancer in both 2017 and 2018, as well as the Helpmann Award in 2017.

MARCO CHER-GIBARD (Composition)

Marco Cher-Gibard (b. Auckland, 1983), is an artist working with sound to explore contemporary culture, expression and experience. He is part of the Chinese diaspora via Singapore, Thailand and New Zealand.

Marco's award winning theatrical compositions and sound designs have been presented both locally at Dance Massive, Arts House Seasons, New Breed (Sydney Dance Company) and internationally by organisations such as London International Festival of Theatre (UK), Vienna Festwochen (Austria), Holland Festival (Holland), Theatre der Welt (Germany) and Melbourne International Arts Festival (Australia), amongst others.

GEOFFREY WATSON (Costume)

Geoffrey Watson is a Melbourne-based artist, whose work is rooted in choreography and has branches in but has branches in costume/set design, fashion, sculpture and distraction tactics.

Geoffrey's costume and set design has appeared in works by Lilian Steiner, Brooke Stamp, Holly Durant,

Leah Landau and BalletLab. Geoffrey has worked as a performer with companies and artists including Phillip Adams, Lucy Guerin Inc., Nana Biluš-Abaffy, Alisdair Macindoe, Lilian Steiner Natalie Abbott, Lee Serle, Alisdair Macindoe, Gekidan Kaitaisha and The Australian Ballet.

GIOVANNA YATE GONZALEZ (Lighting)

Giovanna Yate Gonzalez is an emerging lighting designer and multidisciplinary professional from Colombia. She graduated from the Production Bachelor at VCA in Lighting Design. Work includes the lighting design for the interdisciplinary dance project "Ten Degrees", MMA, and the Musical "Sweet Charity" at Space 28 VCA 2021, theatre performances such as "Nora: A Doll's House" at the Union House Theatre in April 2022 and "Fast Food" at Red Stitch in June 2022, dance performances "Passing" by Isabelle Beauverd and "Siren Dance" by Lilian Steiner at Dancehouse March 2022. Also, she had a collaborative lighting installation, "Talk to Me", with musician Monica Lim at the Bundoora Homestead Art Centre.

AARTI JADU (Vocals)

Aarti Jadu's solo practice combines electronic production and vocals to conceptualise an ongoing research of the internal human experience, a theme derived from a lifelong connection to devotional music. Aarti's performances are often wordless, boldly minimal yet emotive and evocative. In this project Aarti will draw on ideas of the terms Self and Culture to present the oscillation between singularity and wholeness.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

Siren Dance is a solo work of roughly 45 minutes.

It is performed in a black box theatre with a seating bank at one 'front'.

The work happens in two main parts, connected by a short, onstage costume change 'interlude'.

There is partial nudity in this changing section, but with the performer facing side-on in the far upstage corner.

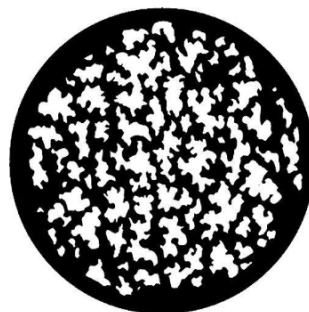

dimensions, the lighting designer might edit the
lighting plan to improve the rig. This is just a basic
option considering DANCEHOUSE's stock and
venue.

Audio-Visual

Microphones and Hardware

- 1* SM58 – hung from the ceiling.
- 1* Reverb/Delay effect – Either a pedal or in desk echo/delay.
- 1* Laptop Running Qlab 4
- 1* Soundcard with 4 outputs.

Front of House

- 2* Meyer UPQs
- 1* Meyer 650HP sub.
- Front Fill where necessary.
- Monitoring 2* Meyer UPJs

PROJECTOR

Projector (with internal shutters)

- * It is programmed in Qlab with the sound Q list.
- * Projector to be rigged with enough distance to reach the mostly the full back of the stage
- * Projector to be covered with Black Cinefoil to reduce light spill (below mock up). This is because the video will be projected just at the bottom of the full screen.
