Dancehouse is committed to making performances as accessible and welcoming as possible for all audiences.

Dancehouse is located at **150 Princes Street, Carlton North**. The venue is wheelchair accessible, with step-free entry and accessible bathroom facilities. If you have specific access requirements you would like us to know, or would like to discuss your visit in advance, we encourage you to contact the RISING ticketing team or Dancehouse ahead of time.

Please note that the following information is intended as a guide for audiences and may be updated as final production details are confirmed.

Exposure

Venue: Sylvia Staehli Theatre, Dancehouse

Duration: Approx. 60 minutes

Lockout: Late entry will be guided by ushers at an appropriate window within 10 minutes of showstart. Entry beyond 10 minutes of showstart won't be permitted. Check in during performance week for more information.

Content and sensory information

Exposure is a contemporary performance work that includes:

- loud music and amplified sound
- flashing lights
- sudden or shifting lighting states
- low light and darkness
- haze or atmospheric effects
- strong physical movement
- close proximity between performers and audience, depending on seating configuration

Audiences should expect a dynamic and sensory-rich theatrical environment.

Access considerations

- Wheelchair accessible venue
- Accessible toilets available onsite
- Seating can be adjusted to accommodate access needs where possible

Warning: *Exposure* by Branch Nebula contains smoke/haze, partial nudity and loud sounds.

Audience advice

This work may be suitable for audiences who are comfortable with intense contemporary performance, strong sound, and changing visual environments. Audience members with sensory sensitivities may wish to contact the venue in advance for further detail.

At this time, Dancehouse is unable to offer the following access provisions for this presentation:

- Relaxed performances
- Auslan-interpreted performances
- Audio description

This work is highly visual and non-verbal in nature, and can be experienced without reliance on spoken language.

Travel to Dancehouse

By Tram

No. 1 and No.6

Stop 114 Princes/Lygon St.

The nearest level access stop is 112 Lygon/Elgin St. (170m from tram stop to Dancehouse front door)

No. 96

Stop 15 Alexandra Pde/Nicholson St.

This is a level access stop (450m from tram stop to Dancehouse front door)

YarraTrams aims to run every service on Route 96 with a low-floor tram.

To find out if the next tram at your stop will be a low-floor tram, look for the wheelchair symbol on [tramTRACKER®](#)

By Train

Any train to Melbourne Central, then a 15-minute walk through Carlton (2.4 km)

Parking

Limited on-street parking is available on Rathdowne, Drummond and Princes St. Please note each street has different parking rules and need to be permitted.
